STANDING STRONG, FOCUSED ON WHAT MATTERS

The challenges we face as a country are real: rising costs, pressure on our healthcare and public systems, and a global economy in transition. But so too are the opportunities to build a stronger, more resilient, and more inclusive Canada. As your Member of Parliament for Winnipeg West, I am committed to working with our government to meet these challenges head-on and deliver real results for our community.

Every conversation I have, whether at the door, in the community, or in Ottawa, informs the work I do. I hear from families working hard to keep up, seniors concerned about the future of their care, and young people striving for opportunity and stability. That is why I am proud to be part of a government focused on making life more affordable, strengthening the middle class, and building an economy that works for everyone.

AFFORDABILITY

Affordability remains my top priority because it affects nearly every aspect of daily life. From putting food on the table to paying rent or covering medications, families across Winnipeg West are feeling the strain.

I am working closely with government colleagues to expand access to affordable housing, support families and seniors with the rising cost of living, and advance a national pharmacare plan based on fairness and dignity. These are essential supports for people who need help now. We are already implementing targeted measures to make life more affordable. For instance, the middle-class tax cuts benefit 22 million Canadians, saving a typical two-income family up to \$840 a year. Additionally, we are eliminating the GST on homes priced up to \$1 million, which can save first-time homebuyers up to \$50,000.



HEALTHCARE

Healthcare is deeply personal to me. With a background in medicine, with over 25 years in emergency care, I understand how the system works and where it needs to improve. Across our community, I hear the same concerns: long wait times, difficulty finding a family doctor, and gaps in mental health care. Although healthcare delivery is a provincial responsibility, the federal government has an essential role. I am advocating for targeted investments in primary care, mental health services, and rural access to ensure every Canadian receives timely, high-quality care. I also strongly support expansion of the national pharmacare program as no one should have to choose between their health and paying their bills.

We also need to confront the spread of misinformation about vaccines and public health. False information erodes trust and puts lives at risk. I am working to make sure residents have access to clear, reliable, and science-based health information they can trust.

ECONOMY

Economic security is about more than jobs. It is about building a resilient economy that supports Canadian workers and businesses over the long term. I am working with our government to strengthen Canada's economic independence by supporting local industries, diversifying trade relationships, and investing in innovation and good-paying jobs. This includes removing interprovincial trade barriers, expanding global trade agreements, and creating opportunities for Winnipeg West.

Whether you live in Crestview, Westwood, Rosser, Headingley, or Tuxedo, I will continue to be a strong voice for our community. I am focused on real results, not partisanship, and I will keep listening, advocating, and delivering for the people of Winnipeg West.



LEGISLATIVE UPDATE FROM OTTAWA

Parliament has officially risen for the summer, and I am proud to report back on a busy and productive session in Ottawa. One of the most meaningful moments this session was delivering my maiden speech in the House of Commons. I used this opportunity to outline the priorities I will be championing on behalf of the people of Winnipeg West, including making life more affordable, investing in infrastructure, and ensuring economic opportunity for all. I spoke about the values and aspirations of our community, and how they must continue to guide the work we do in Ottawa.

Affordability remains one of the most pressing concerns for families in Winnipeg West. That's why I supported the introduction of Bill C-4, *the Affordability Measures Act*, which delivers targeted relief to Canadians feeling the pressure of rising costs. This legislation introduces a middle-class tax cut, eliminates the GST for first-time homebuyers, and repeals the federal consumer carbon price. We also made important progress toward a more connected and competitive national economy with the passage of Bill C-5, *the One Canadian Economy Act*. The legislation, which has since become a law, removes interprovincial trade barriers, improves labour mobility, and streamlines federal approvals for large infrastructure projects. By building one Canadian economy out of thirteen, we are laying a stronger foundation for long-term prosperity and ensuring that Manitoba and our region are part of the country's economic future.



SHAPING POLICY THROUGH ACTION

I am honoured to have been reappointed to the Standing Committee on Health (HESA), where we are focused on strengthening health care access across Canada. From advancing national pharmacare to addressing health equity, the committee's work is helping shape solutions that matter to families in Winnipeg West and across the country. Manitoba's recent agreement with the federal government to cover essential medications like contraceptives and diabetes treatments is a strong example of this progress in action.

I am also proud to be part of the newly formed Liberal Physician Caucus, a group of physician MPs committed to bringing front-line clinical experience into national health policy. In our first series of meetings, we engaged directly with Health Minister Marjorie Michel, SickKids Canada, MSF Canada, and the Canadian Medical Association to discuss how we can improve access and outcomes, particularly in underserved communities. Whether through committee leadership or health policy advocacy, I remain focused on delivering meaningful results for Winnipeg West and ensuring that real-world experience informs the decisions made in Ottawa.



CONSTITUENCY UPDATE

Investing in Community Infrastructure: St. James Civic Centre Expansion

I was proud to join provincial and municipal leaders, alongside members of our community, to celebrate the official launch of the St. James Civic Centre expansion, backed by a \$5.2 million federal investment.

This project goes beyond bricks and mortar. It is an investment in people — in families, youth, seniors, and newcomers. The upgraded Centre will include new multi-purpose spaces, accessible features, and updated amenities to serve our growing and diverse community. It's a space that reflects our values: inclusion, connection, and opportunity for all. This initiative is also part of our Framework to Build a Green Prairie Economy, supporting sustainable, climate-resilient infrastructure while fostering local economic opportunity.



Canada Day: Honouring Our Past, Celebrating Our Future



This Canada Day, I had the honour of beginning the day at a citizenship ceremony where 30 new Canadians officially joined our national family. Their stories of resilience and hope remind us why Canada continues to inspire people around the world. Throughout the day, I visited retirement residences across Winnipeg West - from Metropolitan Kiwanis Courts to Venvi Wellington, Sturgeon Creek I and II, and the Westhaven delivering flowers, sharing stories, and thanking the seniors who have built the foundation of this incredible community. The day ended at Assiniboia Downs, where we capped off our celebrations with joy, connection, and community spirit. It was a day of reflection, unity, and gratitude - a true celebration of what it means to belong.
